

Whilst working as a living canvas for an abusive tattoo artist in the slums of 19th-century New York, Flora meets Minnie, an enigmatic disabled circus performer who offers her love and refuge in a luxurious townhouse that is home to the intimidating and predatory Mr Chester Merton. Flora earns her keep reading tarot cards for his guests whilst struggling to harness her gift, the Knowing – an ability to communicate with the dead. Caught in a dark love triangle between Minnie and Chester, Flora begins to unravel the secrets inside their house. Then at her first public séance in the infamous cathouse Hotel du Woods, Flora hears the spirit of a murdered boy prostitute and exposes his killer, setting off a train of events that leaves Flora fighting for her life.

Beautiful, intoxicating and full of suspense, *The Knowing* is a story of love and obsession, betrayal and retribution, of how women survive and weaponise trauma.

Emma Hinds is a queer playwright living in Manchester with a focus on telling untold feminist narratives. Her latest play, PURE, was featured in Turn On Fest at Hope Mill Theatre Manchester in 2021 and she was the recipient of the Artist Development Grant 2021 at Hope Mill Theatre. She has written non-fiction in her capacity as an academic, with an essay published in *Tarantino and Theology* with Gray Matter Books, and her book *Ineffable Love: Exploring Christian Themes in* GOOD OMENS, published by Darton Longman & Todd.




It's the Sixties. Skirts are short, shirts are cheesecloth and The Beatles are more popular than Jesus. Yet idling in the suburbs, Atbara Avenue retains a sense of restraint. Each pastel-painted house offers a respectable facade to its smiling counterpart over the road.

Ask anyone how well they know their neighbours, they'll reply at once: 'Well indeed'. Silly question. They see each other every day. Their faces are as familiar as the patterns on the kitchen blinds.

The local vicar and his wife would assure you that it is a most conventional and upstanding community. When the body is discovered of a local girl thought to have run away years ago, their faith in the moral compass of their neighbours is unshaken. Surely an outsider was responsible for such a horror? Peace and order will soon resume. No matter if murder passes, unseen, beneath one's nose. As long as the front garden is tidy, all's right with the world.

Dark and dryly funny, with a delicious cast of characters and dazzling plotting, Gay Marris's first novel heralds a fresh and compelling new voice in crime fiction.

Dr Gay Marris is a retired research scientist. Her career focused on insect ecology, parasites and honey bee health. A Curtain Twitcher's Book of Murder is her first novel, set in the deceptively dangerous suburbs of 1960s London, where she grew up. Gay now lives in York with her husband, a cat and a tortoise.





An Honest Living

Dwyer Murphy

After leaving behind the comforts and the shackles of a prestigious law firm, a restless attorney makes ends meet in mid-2000s Brooklyn by picking up odd jobs from a colourful assortment of clients. When a mysterious woman named Anna Reddick turns up at his apartment with ten thousand dollars in cash and asks him to track down her missing husband, an antiquarian bookseller who she believes has been pilfering rare true crime volumes from her collection, he trusts it will be a quick and easy case. But when the real Anna Reddick — a magnetic but unpredictable literary prodigy — lands on his doorstep with a few bones to pick, he finds himself out of his depth, drawn into a series of deceptions involving Joseph Conrad novels, unscrupulous booksellers, aspiring flâneurs, and seedy real estate developers.

A sharp and stylish debut set against the backdrop of New York at the tail end of the analogue era and immersed in the worlds of literature and bookselling, *An Honest Living* is a gripping story of artistic ambition, obsession, and the small crimes we commit against one another every day.

The Stolen Coast

Adrift in a sleepy coastal Massachusetts town, a man who ferries fugitives by day gets twisted up in a plot to pilfer diamonds in a heist novel that infuses Elmore Leonard and *Casablanca*.

Jack might be a polished, Harvard-educated lawyer on paper, but everyone in the down-at-heel, if picturesque, village of Onset knows his real job: moving around people on the run from powerful enemies. Except for the occasional fumble, the family business – co-managed with his father, a retired spy – is smooth sailing, filling up Onset's holiday homes during the town's long, drowsy off-season. But when Elena, Jack's enigmatic former flame – and former client-fugitive – makes an unexpected return to town, wealthy fiancé in tow, her arrival upends Jack's routine existence. Elena, after all, doesn't go anywhere without a scheme in mind, and it isn't long before Jack finds himself enmeshed in her latest hustle: intercepting millions of dollars' worth of raw diamonds before they're shipped overseas.

With sharp wit and stylish prose, *CrimeReads* editor-in-chief Dwyer Murphy serves up an irresistible page-turner as full of heart as it is of drama.

Lebanon, 2006. The Israel–Hezbollah war is tearing Beirut apart and the country is on the brink of chaos.

In the midst of this turmoil, the CIA and Mossad are targeting a reclusive Hezbollah terrorist, Najib Qassem. Najib is believed to be planning the assassination of the Secretary of State, who is coming to Beirut in ten days to broker a ceasefire.

They turn to a young Lebanese-American CIA agent. Analise comes up with the perfect plan: she has befriended Qassem's grandson, and will use this friendship to locate the terrorist and kill him. As the plan is put into action, though, Analise begins to suspect that Mossad has a motive of its own.

She alerts the agency but their response is for her to drop it. Analise is now the target and there is no one she can rely on. And the one person she might have to trust — a reporter for the *New York Times* — might not be who he says he is...

The Genie and the Demon

The debut of ChatGPT on November 30th 2022 was a watershed moment in the history of technology. We stand on the threshold of a new age - one where content of all kinds, even software itself, will be conjured, seemingly from thin air, with simple conversation.


