





In 2007, Simonetta and her husband made the quixotic decision to open a restaurant. Without any relevant experience they put aside their careers to throw themselves (and their three young children) into their dream.

This is the story of Ida, a tiny resilient restaurant perched between a barren thoroughfare in north London and a notorious crack estate, that survived (only just) the 2008 economic crash and the pandemic lockdown to become an internationally renowned haven of Italian home cooking.

The Little Clothes






Amma has been arrested on suspicion of murdering Mark Stormont, a new detective on the Wakestead police force. But she won't speak to the police.




Deadly Will






